As many of you know, **Dr. Ernie Rose** is retiring from full-time faculty service at LMU at the end of this academic year. We would like to acknowledge and thank him for his great service and contributions as Director of the Doctoral Program and share with you that **Dr. Jill Bickett** will become the next Director of the Ed.D. in Educational Leadership for Social Justice program. Dr. Bickett is currently Clinical Professor in the Department of Educational Leadership and Associate Director of the Doctoral Program. In her role as Associate Director she provides leadership across all aspects of the program, including curriculum, assessment, recruitment, student services, alumni engagement, budgeting, and other responsibilities. She is a member of the Doctoral Committee, and has served as Chair of multiple dissertations and on many other candidates' dissertation committees. She has taught a range of courses at LMU at the doctoral, master's and undergraduate levels. Dr. Bickett is a triple-alumna of LMU, including as a graduate of our Ed.D. in Educational Leadership for Social Justice program. Before coming to LMU, Dr. Bickett spent 23 years at Marymount High School, Los Angeles, where she began as an English teacher, moved up to Department Chair, then to Academic Dean, and finally to leader of the school. Dr. Elizabeth Reilly has been approved by the Provost to be appointed as Chair of the Department of Educational Leadership for a three-year term beginning May 16, 2016 and ending May 15, 2019.
