Research Opportunities

Howard University's School of Education and The American Association of School Administrators (AASA) have partnered to offer the <u>Urban Superintendents' Academy</u>. This year-long Academy will offer aspiring and currently serving superintendents a revolutionary new approach to ensuring success in urban settings and recruit a new generation of minority educators to the superintendency. - Creative and professionally engaging culminating projects that ensure publication as part of the credentialing process.
- Ongoing career counseling and coaching, including frequent simulations of interviews, public forums, and stakeholder group simulations.
- An annual national conference open to all to participates in workshops, presentations, discussions, and problem solving related to urban school districts and leadership.
