U.S. News Again Names LMU a Top-Ranked School of Education

Loyola Marymount University's School of Education was again among the top-ranked schools in U.S. News & World Report's latest edition of "Best Graduate Schools." Rising four spots from last year, SOE is 70th out of the 356 graduate schools surveyed and more than 1,500 schools, colleges and departments of education nationwide. The SOE has climbed 61 positions since 2011.

The LMU School of Education is the third-highest ranked Jesuit institution, behind Boston College and Ford-ham University. LMU is the third-ranked independent school of education in California, behind Stanford and USC. Of the more than 80 education programs in California, LMU is ranked eighth.


