Dr. Rudy Cuevas (MA School Administration '06 and Ed.D. '13) was promoted to Principal and Chief Collaboration Officer at Youthbuild Charter School of California. As CCO at YCSC, Rudy is responsible for fostering collaboration between YCSC, its 19 YouthBuild program partners, and all of their respective stakeholders towards the kind of education that leads to social change.

Bryce Davis (Cohort 6) was granted the LADWP Feed-in Tariff Program incentive to install solar panels in the parking lot of the New Hope Baptist Church, which shares its space with City of Youth Academy charter school in South Central Los Angeles. City of Youth Academy provides underperforming students (aged 15-25) with an enriching high school diploma program through experiential, project-based curricula to support community development. City of Youth Academy students will have the opportunity to participate in a solar installation certification program. Paper and Poster Proposals: Please remember that research paper and poster proposals are dueSeptember 5 (as are all ACPA proposals). These sessions provide an excellent venue for faculty, graduate students, and others to share their research. Please consider submitting a research paper or poster proposal and encouraging your students to do so as well.

Research Paper: Designed for the presentation of scholarly research, particularly by graduate students or faculty members, each 75-minute program slot will include presentation of three research papers (20 minutes each) followed by a brief discussion.

Research Poster Session: The research poster session is designed for discussion about research projects that are in process or have been completed. Presenters display their research on a large bulletin board and are available to discuss their display and interact with those circulating the room. We have attached a template for submissions. You'll need to tweak things a bit for papers and posters. Do

We have attached a template for submissions. You'll need to tweak things a bit for papers and posters. Do include: (a) an abstract, (b) paper or poster description in the "program description box," (c) references. You do not need to include: (a) program outline, (b) learning objectives. In the description, provide a substantive overview of the research entailed in your paper or poster (e.g., purpose, conceptual/theoretical framework, research questions, methods, findings, discussion, and significance). If the research is not yet complete, provide evidence to the reviewers that papers will be complete by February and posters by the convention in March. Accepted papers will be due to reviewers by **February 22, 2014**. Submit proposals here.

The School of Education at the University of Michigan is conducting an open-rank search to hire several colleagues with expertise in research methodology, whose scholarship focuses on the study of diversity and equity in educational contexts. The goal of this cluster hire is to galvanize and focus collaborative research efforts that will draw synergistically on different research methodologies in order to (1) optimize the educational and social benefits of diversity, and (2) redress inequities related to social, cultural, and economic differences. This is a school-level search for senior and junior scholars, and individuals with expertise from throughout the PK-20 range are invited to apply. Nominations and applications will be reviewed beginning **October 7, 2103**, and will continue until the position is filled. We seek to make appointments that will begin in **September 2014**.
